Project description:

The project promotes the empowerment of vulnerable women in poverty by building human capital to be economically independent by strengthening capacities and / or productive skills that allow them to improve their quality of life. Provides technical training for self-employment via the development of an enterprise with the skills acquired in the production workshops of: a) Cutting and tailoring (basic, medium and advanced) and b) Printing on clothing. The Project counts for its sustainability with the support of the Association of residents of the Portales de Basilio Auqui Human Settlement, which has legal status and represents 5,000 residents duly registered in public registries and recognized by national and local authorities.; who will facilitate the formation of the management of committees of beneficiary women to associate to form enterprises and continue with the delivery of the workshops over time; There is also the commitment of the Provincial Municipality of San Antonio to provide security to the premises and to provide maintenance and sustainability to the workshops. The project also seeks to facilitate links with small and medium-sized companies of the Gamarra Textile emporium and public-private associations so that they sub-contract women participating in these programs by guaranteeing the delivery and quality of the ready-made products. Women are often the head of the family as single mothers and have 02 or more minor children that they cannot leave home alone for long periods and did not complete a secondary or higher educational training. And in this circumstance, due to the Covid-19 impact, many have seen their jobs lose and their resources from their small entrepreneurship diminish due to sanitary restrictions; Women in this type of settlement need to generate yes or yes a source of income to survive and demonstrate a mettle and courage to get ahead and therefore the relevance of placing these workshops near their homes that we call "Sconco Warmi" which means Heart of woman.

The area of interest in the project is Community Economic Development.

Beneficiary Population (Name of the Community and indicate number of people)

San Antonio de Jicamarca Community - Lima. The direct beneficiaries in the first year are 120 women and their low-income families living in the peri-urban area. In 05 years there will be approximately 600 beneficiaries; In this population, the water service was recently installed and they have the public lighting service through power lines and only through distribution points.
